Dear Sir or Madam,

As part of our **local Carers Week campaign**, we wanted to take the opportunity to highlight the **importance of identifying and supporting unpaid carers in Primary Care**.

Carers frequently step in to reduce the burden on health and social care services. If a carer becomes unwell, the needs of a cared for person often turns into an emergency presenting issues for both primary and secondary care. Early identification and connections to local support are therefore vital; it can significantly improve a carers health and wellbeing, as well as having positive benefits for the person being cared for.

Across the South Tees it is **estimated that there are 30,000 carers**, although we suspect this to be much higher. One of the **main obstacles** to **carers** getting the right support is **identification** – both self-identification and identification by health professionals.

Primary Care plays a critical role in identifying and supporting carers. We therefore encourage you and your colleagues to look at our website (**wecareyoucare.info**) to develop your knowledge and consider ways you can improve identification of carers and where you can signpost them in order to access further support.

We have created a handy <u>Healthcare Professionals in Primary Care Guide</u> which encourages you to consider the needs of carers and provides information on the range of local services enabling you to refer and signpost quickly and easily. It is vital that carers have their own health needs met.
